Well, as always the kids had one heck of a time at this year's rodeos. Both rodeo events were held at two new locations.

Rodeos are great ways to bring kids together for the fun of riding. It is also an awesome social event where youth from all walks of life can share stories in an environment that is not intimidating or overly restrictive. Safety is key and everyone participates in ensuring that it is.

Bethesda Children's Home in Meadville, PA and Black Mountain Home for Children located in Black Mountain, NC were the new hosts of our Northeast and Southeast Rodeos respectively. Both campuses have hundreds of acres of land that include recreation facilities, lodging, camping areas and riding trails.



The Southeast Rodeo saw 58 people attend from 2 states; 32 of those were kids having the time of their lives. The Northeast Rodeo had 103 people in attendance and 52 of them were young NYPUM Certified Riders; 8 programs from NY, MA and PA brought their kids and adult supporters.

Our inaugural Honda Dealer ShoutOut goes to the family and crew of Street Track 'n Trail in Conneaut Lake, PA.

In 1968 Dick and Joanne Lepley, the founders, had a small amount of money borrowed from Joanne's family, coupled to a dream to be in the motorcycle business, and the energy that only comes with youth. In 1969 the operation moved to the Conneaut Lake road about a mile east of its current location. After a two year struggle [with

building the business], the Lepley's were able to secure a Honda motorcycle franchise and the business became Street Track 'N Trail, Inc. When Dick and Joanne opened their door and their hearts to their customers in 1968 they were determined to operate under a very simple but powerful precept...to sell only the best products at a fair price, and provide those who purchased them with the best service possible.

Fast forward to today, "STnT" as it's called is run by their two kids Debbie and Bryan. They carry on that same commitment and continue to be strong supporters and advocates of NYPUM. As we say in our family, to the Lepley's and their entire staff, YOU ROCK.
